President Stewart asked if there were any proponents?

Finance Director Pileski explained that annually the City of Elyria is required by the Ohio Revised Coded to pass what is called the Tax Budget. What was presented before council was the 2025 Tax Budget. The presented Tax Budget kicked off the appropriation process for next year. The document presented estimates amounts available to spend by fund type. The fund types are, general fund, which is a fund type unto itself, special revenue funds, which the city currently has forty-five special revenue funds, one tax increment financing fund, which would be the Chestnut Commons fund, seven capital project funds, two debt service funds, six enterprise funds, which would be the business type activity funds, two internal service funds, eighteen trust and custodial funds, and a fund for the Elyria Public Library, as the city is a conduit issuer for the library's bonds and their monies flows through the county from us to them. explained his responsibility is to estimate cash in each fund at the end of April 2024, and estimate revenues moving forward for the remainder of this year, estimate remainder expenditures, and finalize the balance at the end of the year beginning of 2025, that balance becomes the amount reflected on the certificate of estimated resources with the Lorain County Budget Commission. Finance Director Pileski reminded council that this year there are two funds to pay particular attention to: the general fund is starting with a very high cash balance, he explained the reason is that the city has used American Rescue Plan Act monies to pay for certain general fund activities. The other fund is the employee's health insurance fund. At the beginning of 2025, the city will need to move thirty police officers and seventeen firefighters from the American Rescue Plan Act back into the general fund. That totals 5.8 million dollars in payroll. Cash is estimated at 14.6 million t the beginning of 2025. At the end of 202510.6 million. The city will spend more than what we bring in according to Finance Director Pileski, mainly because the people being moved into the general fund. Finance Director Pileski stated that he is hopeful the city will begin to collect some more tax revenue to cut into the deficit. The employee's health insurance fund is an internal service fund, funded eighty-five percent by the city, fifteen percent by the employees. If there are no changes to the fund, the city would be slipping into the red by the end of 2025 in the employees' health insurance fund. Upon approval, the presented document will be submitted to the Loran County Budget Commission. At the end of 2024, beginning of 2025, the document would be amended to reflect actual cash available in each fund. The expenditure portion is removed when council passes the permanent appropriation in March.

Council member Tollett asked if there has been any update from the state of Ohio regarding the additional PERS contribution for the city? Finance Director Pileski stated not at the time. He explained the Ohio Public Employees Retirement System plans to increase the employer share and also the police pension fund plans to increase the employer share. The total that is being requested will cost the city an extra two million dollars per year in payroll costs.

Mayor Brubaker:

Mayor Brubaker shared that earlier in the evening in Ely Square Park, a celebration honoring Mateo Medina was held for his accomplishments for the 2024 Track State Championship, where he won the 100, 200 and 40 meter which led to him single-handedly winning the division one state championship for the team. The celebration was in collaboration with the Elyria School District, Coaches and teammates. Mayor Brubaker expressed his appreciation to the Elyria Fire department for using the department ladder truck, the Elyria Police department and the Parks and Recreation department that were all involved in escorting Mateo Medina into the square. Mayor Brubaker updated council members of a task force that was implemented the week of July 1st to handle fireworks complaints. Mayor Brubaker requested that Police Captain Welsh compile a report that provides the data of the types of complaints received. From July 2nd through July 7th, one hundred eighty-three calls for service were received. Of the one hundred eighty-three calls, there were nineteen arrests were issued, majority ere fireworks, one was for aggravating menacing. Mayor Brubaker provided accolades to Sergeant Walker who spoke with over two hundred residents regarding fireworks issues. Sergeant walker parks his cruiser and walks the neighborhoods of concern and speaks directly with residents. Residents are encouraged to call the non-emergency line of 440-323-3302 with fireworks concerns. Task force officers will respond to the calls.

Council member Siwierka applauded the Brubaker administration and everyone working on this taskforce. She expressed the publicity was highly visible and the City of Elyria is reflective of enforcing rules and regulations and that neighbors throughout the community were appreciative.

Council member Lipian inquired about a report regarding an ambulance committee report audit. Mayor Brubaker responded that he is not familiar with legal issues concerning Lifecare.

Safety Service Director:

Safety Service Director Pyanowski provided information on the Annual Kerstetter Memorial 5k scheduled for July 13, 2024 at East Falls. SSD Pyanowski shared that fireworks at West Park went very well, he expressed credit to the Parks and Recreation department Director Carrie Reardon and the parks crew as well as other city departments that participated. He also recognized the 6:30 a.m. Saturday morning clean-up crew that cleaned the park after the fireworks.

Council member Siwierka inquired about the status of recycling items. She also stated that she has noticed and submitted a high number of incidents of hoarding, property maintenance issues. She suggested a focused committee meeting for the issue specifically. SSF Pyanowski explained the financial risk associated with the recycling, because it cost more per ton than trash. The administration is reviewing effective cost effectiveness regarding recycling. The hoarding concerns are in progress of being addressed.

Council member Lipian suggested that also if there is an option for access to mental health services in the hoarding situations. In addition, regarding recycling, he inquired about recycling education materials. SSD Pyanowski stated he agreed and that is what is currently being worked on.

Council member Callahan inquired about what percentage of items collected are actually recycled? SSD Pyanowski stated the is was unsure f exact percentages, however he understands that we are not doing very well and have a lot of room for improvement.

Council member Lipian asked for clarification regarding properly recycled items providing funding back to the city. Mayor Brubaker clarified that Solid Waste grants ended in 2022. There is no financial benefit from recycling.

Finance Director:

Finance Director Pileski updated council members on the completion of the Independent Audit, he explained the 2023 financial statements single audit report has been submitted and certified to the Federal Audit Clearing House by the independent auditors and himself. It is anticipated to be completed by Columbus by July 29th.

Finance Director Pileski thanked council members for their support and well wishes while he was out for knee replacement surgery. He shared he will have the left knee replaced in September.

Gulf Road will be open for two- way traffic up to Dilworth. East Broad Street excavation will begin the week of July 15th from South Logan to South Abbe Rd. Cleveland Street project is continuous. Curbs are being installed around Gulf Road. Traffic lights are being worked, as well as asphalt installation. Street resurfacing will begin the week of the July 15th as well. Council member Oswald inquired if the aprons would be installed along with curbs on Gulf Rd.? Engineer Schneider responded yes, however no sewer work would be completed. Council member Siwierka inquired of S. Abbe between Broad and University, when would the work begin? Engineer Schneider explained the project is with Ohio Public Works and has not been scheduled for bid. Council member Siwierka asked for clarification that Broad Street would be completed before the work begins on University. Engineer Schneider stated that it should be completed.

President Stewart asked if a projection on Cleveland Street completion could be provided. Engineer Schneider shared the contractor pace is slower than anticipated, however there is not much work left to complete. He anticipates early November. President Stewart asked for an update to the FBI Training facility. Engineer Schneider explained dirt is being brought in and other cost saving efforts that keeps the project moving along.

Council member Mitchell inquired when might resurfacing begin. Engineer Schneider responded the week of July 15th.

Council member Lipian inquired of resurfacing for a portion of Miami. Engineer Schneider explained the hopes are to complete the concrete roads, odds are Miami will not be resurfaced.
