5. REMARKS AND REPORTS OF CITY OFFICIALS:

Mayor Brubaker:

Mayor Brubaker welcomed Council members to the first meeting of the New Year. He expressed his excitement for 2025. Mayor Brubaker stated that his team would be meeting on Monday January 13th for a yearly planning session and he welcomed council members to submit any ideas, thoughts, or suggestions that he could implement into the meeting.

Safety Service Director:

SSD Pyanowski shared that the weekend of January 4th and 5th was the first major snow event. In total there was about five to six inches of snow that fell. City crews plowed for over thirty-six to forty-eight hours. City employees helped plow over multiple shifts. SSD Pyanowski expressed his appreciation to the employees and the street department for keeping things organized.

Finance Director:

Finance Director Pileski stated that with all of the cash basis entries posted for 2024, his report would be brief regarding the general fund. The beginning of 2024 started with \$14 million cash balance in the general fund, finished the year with \$15.3 million. Revenues exceeded expenditure by \$1.3 million in the general fund. However here was an additional 4.6 million of expenditures accounted for in the ARPA fund, American Rescue Plan Act fund, which normally would be accounted for in the general fund. Finance Director Pileski explained moving forward it will be accounted for in the general fund, beginning this year. He explained, when you factor that into the equation, expenditure would exceed revenues in the general fund by 3.5 million. With ARPA

money being gone, there is only enough to cover encumbrances and open purchase orders. The city of Elyria can expect to draw down on the Reserve this year in the general fund and does not include any pay increase.

Council member Siwierka inquired if the million day pay to ABC development was factored into the numbers provided? Finance Director Pileski responded, yes.

Council member Tollett inquired about income taxes over the year? Finance Director Pileski 2024 was flat for income taxes and that the year overall was leveled.

Law Director Deery:

Law Director Deery wished everyone a Happy New Year and thanked members of council for their patience over the holiday as numerous emails were exchanged regarding the former Holiday Inn. New Year's Day the former owner signed the judgement entry. The city of Elyria is pleased with the specifics of the agreement. Law Director Deery announced new Attorney Katie Kefir who came onboard.

Council member Oswald inquired if the hotel will be able to complete the requirements within the number of days permitted? Law Director Deery explained, the owners have a court order that is legally binding to complete the project with the allotted time.

Council member Siwierka inquired about an update on the lawsuit filed by Mr. Oliver. Law Director Deery stated the city response is due the week of the 13th.
